Nevertheless, She Persisted: The Inspiring Story of Cheryl Dembe, Ph.D.

Wednesday, April 15, 2020 - 7 pm

Your Home, via Zoom!

It's going to be an unusual monthly meeting. First: we will be using Zoom, the newest and easiest way for groups to meet on line. Don't be afraid. If Harriett can do it without a problem, truly anybody can. Reba will send out info on how to participate although I bet a fair few of you already use it.

Second: we are going to have a fabulous speaker, Dr. Cheryl Dembe, Ph.D. She is the woman who made the national news in 2019 when the University of Chicago not only awarded her the Ph.D. in superfluidity she all but completed 48 years before and would have received had her supervising professor not died suddenly just before she was ready to turn it in. Her subject was so advanced in a little-researched area of chemistry at that time that only two professors in the Chemistry department were thought to be qualified to step in to approve submission. One refused because he felt he did not know enough to evaluate such advanced research. The other adamantly refused because, he said, he didn't allow women in his research group.

She challenged the decision at the time but was turned down. The Lafayette resident will tell you how she felt about that and how she dealt with the need to get on with the rest of her life. Included in that life has been a successful 35 year career as the 'First Woman Everything' in the Science Division of Diablo Valley College Science Division: 'the first woman chemist, the first woman Chemistry Department Chair, the first woman Physical Science Division chair (interim) as well as one of the first women to have children while teaching at DVC. (A very partial list!)

A few years ago, she decided to apply again to the University to reconsider its decision in 1971. The positive technique she used combined with the slowly growing change of the status of women in formerly totally male dominated areas and the fact that she had kept all her meticulous research led to the University not only deciding to award the degree but to freely admit that a terrible mistake had been made all those years ago. By the way, two years after she was refused her degree, a man published a comparable project at Cornell and in 1996 won the Nobel Prize for it.

Dr. Dembe, (soon to be Cheryl to all of us but I love using her title), is a woman of many talents and interests including being active in the Bay Area musical, spiritual, religious and tantric communities. She has also been a rancher.

She is a charming and fascinating speaker on the telephone as well as in front of a microphone. Reba talked to her on the phone to make the Zoom arrangements and came away as enthused as Helen and I were talking with her in person. Reba has already suggested that we have her speak in person next year.

SAM at Fair Oaks in March


